Under the header 'Situations', de Appel produces and presents a series of 'performances' that take place on its own premises or in alternative locations (and occasionally in collaboration with partner institutions). Repeating last year's successful partnership, de Appel collaborates with Something RAW, the Flemish-Dutch festival for young choreographers and performance artists. Within the framework of the festival de Appel presents "Marriage à la Mode et Cor Anglais" by Jimmy Robert (FR/BE) and Ian White (GB), a performance realized in co-production with STUK Kunstencentrum in Leuven. The piece opens with a reference to Mapplethorpe's famous portrait of the artists Robert Wilson and Philip Glass, and explores a boundary between movement and the still image, via repetition, artificiality, posing and the spoken word, drawing on texts by Roland Barthes and Frank O'Hara. Choreographed for the theatre, it combines text, music and image into a language of stylized actions. Robert and White previously collaborated on "6 things we couldn't do, but can do now" (Tate Britain, 2004).
