If the budgets are cut by the right wing government, invite all the students with an open call and don't select, act together.

To really test that institution's limits, steal works from a gallery.

Make a radio show.

Act ambiguously.

Give a name to your current mood, let others know who you are today.

Take care of the group members, leave more time to think things over.

Invite paintings to a waltz.

When there is no archive, bring in a clairvoyant.

Adjust your actions to the length of your computer cables and the distance to the sockets in the space.

> Sell flowers at the flower market.

Use language as a transformative tool that can redefine perspectives on identity.

Archive material samples from the exhibition.

Make the budget as detailed as possible, it's a time-saving reference for future curators.

Embrace unpredictability.

Exhibition agency distribution.

Invite an absent artist as co-curator.

Rest together.

Turn off your phone and computer and disappear from cyberspace for 24 hours.

Write about everyday life.

Find meaning in the banal.

Let people stumble upon art in their everyday routines.

Embrace the unexpected public.
